GENERAL INFORMATION



Flitwick Town Council is a large and active Town Council that provides numerous services for the people of Flitwick. It has 17 Councillors and is headed by a Town Mayor. The Town Council owns and manages the Rufus Centre. The Town Council also owns and maintains two allotment sites, the Burial Ground, various playing fields and play areas, Manor Park, various planted areas, the Dew Pond, and the Mount. The Town Council has plans to develop a new Country Park for residents and provide a new burial ground.

The Town Council is committed to ensuring that the community of Flitwick has access to good facilities and services. It works in partnership with various organisations such as Central Bedfordshire Council, the police and local schools, businesses and charities. The Town Council produces a monthly newsletter called the FlitWick papers which it uses to inform the community on issues, news and events. The Town Council also uses social media in the form of Facebook and Twitter to keep residents informed and has two websites; www.flitwick.gov.uk and www.therufuscentre.co.uk.

THE RUFUS CENTRE

The Rufus Centre owned by Flitwick Town Council is a successful and very busy, conference and function venue. The Town Council's offices are based in the building and most of the first floor is leased to businesses. These tenants include private companies, local government departments, charities, a chiropodist and an osteopathic clinic. In all some 150 people are employed here in the building.
